**Presiding --- John Morton, President**

**Present 16 members**

President John called the meeting to order at 7:13 PM. Since our treasurer, Dennis, was not in attendance, there was no Treasurer's report. Minutes were attached to the newsletter.

**Old Business:** Tuber sale, April 27. Sign-up sheet was passed around to sign up for various jobs. There is a cyclone fence between the parking lot and the sale site which may cause some problems. Not much we can do about it.

Publicity has been handled, and Sue will send out the flyer as an attachment to all members so members can send to local friends.

Sue made stakes with dahlia society info to give to people who purchase tubers/cuttings at the sale. Thank you, Sue!

Other old business: Dan's Dahlias participated in the Home and Garden Show in Sacramento. Even though it's too hot for dahlias, Dan sold most of his tubers - John helped.

Our dahlia show ... we don't have a date yet. If you have a favorite dahlia and would like to sponsor it, please do so. Talk to John for details. It's always fun to have extra prizes!

Kelsey Annie Joy will be the open centered bloom of the year. John has lots of tubers. We had agreed to any sport of Spartacus as the fully double flower of the year. There is a rule that you must enter the flower of the year in that category before showing the same bloom in the novice/amature/open to all categories. Some discussion on how the sport would work in that rule.

**New Business:** JoAnna reported that the Livermore Garden Club had invited John and her to speak about dahlias. JoAnna was impressed with the organization of the meeting as well as the respect shown to the speakers.

Ellen Muir agreed to make a presentation at our May meeting to share ways of attending a meeting so that all attendees may participate and benefit from the central discussion.

**Program:** Chris showed how his stored tubers are doing. He had punched holes in the plastic bag and used new peat moss. He also demonstrated the best ways of planting a tuber.

Preparation of the soil is the most important first step. He shared some of his methods: chicken manure, organic compost, green sand and Sul-po-mag (sulphur, potassium and magnesium) The latter needs to be deep in the soil as the roots will use it to help longevity. Then a top-dress of 10-10-10 fertilizer. Some people also use calcium nitrate.

In the hot climates, we should plant the tubers deeper to keep roots cool.

Chris concluded the presentation with a raffle of tubers and cuttings for the members who were present. Thanks, Chris!!
